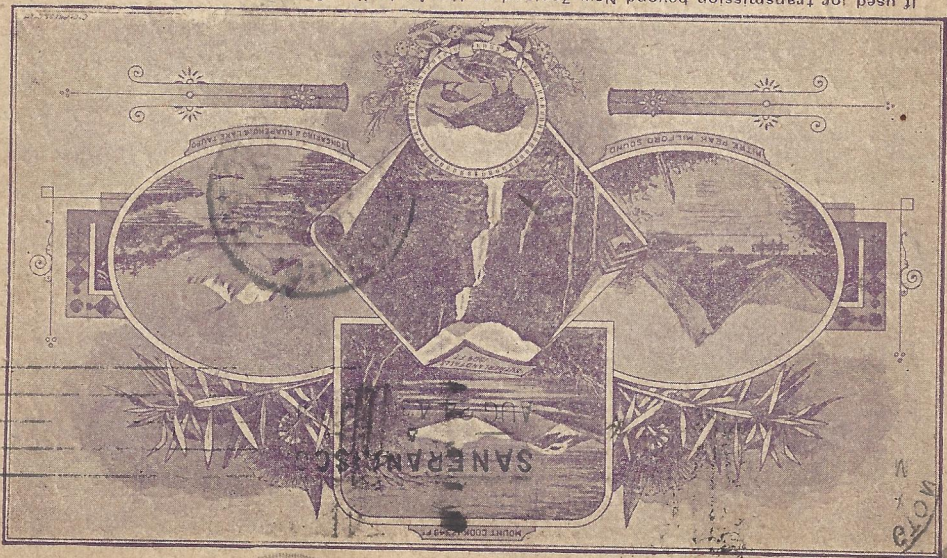

We send this postal clerk to let you know of the second stage of our journey since we left San Francisco We are thankful to say that we had a splendid passage so far as weather is concerned it was smooth all the way while we coasted off the new Zealand coast but it was not very rough dear Mother was a little sea sick the trip all through done us a lot of good thanks be to our Heavenly Father for His kindness & care over us We stayed in Auckland about two days it has gone ahead since you lived there but not so much as the other parts of the Island our destination is Dunedin where trade is very good in my line and I only wish you had been with the voyage would how done you good this is indeed a white men's country milk and bread join in thank love to all from your loving father John Paul
