

1. **Sarah<sup>1</sup> Casaday** [also Cassaday, Cassidy, Cassiday, Casidey], daughter of Thomas Casaday and Elizabeth [—?—], was born about November 1840 in Indiana.<sup>1</sup> Sarah married **William Bunney** on 14 May 1857 in Rock Grove, Floyd County, Iowa,

The 1860 U.S. census information gives Sarah’s age as 18, though based on all other census ages, an age of 19 was expected. The 1870 U.S. census information gives Sarah’s age as 27, though based on all other census ages, an age of 29 was expected. All other censuses consistently align with a November 1841 birthdate. The most likely scenario is that the informants for the 1860 and 1870 U.S. census were in error. In the 1900 census, November 1840 was directly provided for Sarah’s birthdate, but again, the informant is unknown. **Additional research:** Search FamilySearch to locate the 1850 U.S. census information for Sarah Casaday/Bunney.

and the ceremony was officiated by a Justice of the Peace.<sup>2</sup> Sarah was able to read and write but did not appear to work outside the home.<sup>3</sup>

Prior to the 1860 U.S. census, Sarah and William had moved the family to Clay Township, located just outside of Akron in Harrison County, Missouri, and where William returned after serving in the Civil War and was then enumerated in the 1870 U.S. census.<sup>4</sup> In approximately 1875, Sarah's family returned to Rock Grove Township, just outside Nora Springs, Iowa, where they were enumerated in the 1880 U.S. census.<sup>5</sup> Sarah was still living in Rock Grove Township in the first half of 1885, where she was enumerated in the Iowa state census as the head of household, without William Bunney present, having an occupation of "Pauper Invalid," living at township 96, range 18, in the NE corner of the NE corner of section 20.<sup>6</sup> Later in 1885, Sarah moved with several of her children to Franklin, Campbell County, South Dakota.<sup>7</sup> Sarah was enumerated in

Franklin in the 1895 state census and in the 1900 U.S. census.<sup>8</sup> In the 1895 SD state census, William Bunney was residing with the family and listed as head of household. However, Sarah became head of household in October 1898 when William moved to Milwaukee to be admitted into a home for disabled veterans.<sup>9</sup> Sarah, now living in Glenham, Walworth County, South Dakota, became a widow in 27 June 1902.<sup>10</sup> Sarah then lived on a Civil War widow's pension of eight dollars per month while living with her children.<sup>11</sup> Sarah was enumerated in Glenham in the 1910 U.S. census.<sup>12</sup> Sarah died on 15 August 1911 in Glenham.<sup>13</sup>

**Birth:** Pension questionnaire, death certificate, and gravestone consistent on date. Conflicting, 1870 census and probate deposition put the birth year one year earlier and one year later, respectively. All birth sources are consistent on location. **Marriage:** Consistent date in marriage record and 1910 census. Full name of husband found in probate records, consistent with census and death certificate. **Death:** Death certificate and gravestone are consistent.

**Birth:** 1898 pension questionnaire and death certificate agree on October and 1862 but differ on the date as with the 4<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup>. Deposition for probate and 1870 U.S. census infer a birth year of 1863, while the marriage register infers a year of 1861. **Marriage:** No conflicting date between marriage record and marriage register. **Death:** No conflicting information.

**Name:** Conflicts appear throughout records. “Jane” appears in the 1880 census, records shared with Charles Herms, on her gravestone, and her obituary. “Jennie” appears in her first marriage record, the pension questionnaire, and the probate deposition. The common birth date and place, and the reference to Bunney siblings, makes this the same person. The “Elnora” appearing in the 1870 census may reference Jennie but is listed as 2 years too young. Unless William S. and Elnora were twins, this likely referenced Jennie who did have a middle initial of L.

**Birth:** Dates and places align between all sources except the 1930 census. The 1930 census birth year is conflicts with other sources and indicates Jane is four years younger than Charles when all other data shows Jane as one year older, born in 1866.

**Marriages:** No direct information has yet been found on the marriage to Charles Herms. The year of marriage can only be bracketed from the death of James Loeb and being enumerated in the 1930 census with Charles Herms.

**Death:** No conflicting information.

**Birth:** 1880, 1885, and 1900 census information and the probate deposition are consistent on birth dates. The 1900 census directly gives September 1874 as the birth month. The 1898 pension questionnaire, completed by the father with firsthand information, gives conflicting information by stating the birth month for Charles is December. The remaining census sources, birth year varies from 1872 to 1873. The death certificate gives the birth year as 1872 but specified 12 September as the birth date and month.

**Marriage:** No records found indicate Charles was married.

**Death:** Census records show that Charles moved to several locations. The 1910 census has Charles in South Dakota, but more than 300 miles from the rest of the family. The 1915 probate deposition aligns with the 1915 Iowa census that Charles was in Iowa. The 1920 census, both Charles and brother Joseph were living in Edgewood, Pierce Co., Washington. No 1930 or 1940 census information was located. The death certificate found had the incorrect birth year (1872) but was in Pierce County and had the birthday as 12 September, making this most likely the Charles Bunney, son of Sarah Casaday. *Find A Grave* information needs to be verified against cemetery records since the information was not sourced from the death certificate which had no parent information and a different birth year.

**Other:** In the 1915 and 1920 censuses, the birthplace of mother was Missouri, potentially an error by Charles or the informant. Other sources give confidence that the correct Charles Bunney was located. There is doubt on the 1910 census since mother’s birthplace was listed as Pennsylvania and the location of enumeration was so far from the remaining family.

**Birth:** The 1915 probate deposition offers the only conflicting information on birth date, resulting in a birth year one year later than with all other sources listed. The 1915 deposition has consistently offered birth years one year later than expected, except for Jennie who provided the deposition.

**Marriage:** Only the 1900 U.S. census found offered and estimated marriage date in the range of 02 June 1894–01 June 1895. No other sources located at this time offers any other detail on the marriage.

**Death:** Location align with the location given in 1915 deposition. Iver Thompson buried in same cemetery with matching style of gravestone, giving confidence that correct Myrtle Thompson located.

Maude moved with her family to Franklin, Campbell County, South Dakota where she was enumerated in the 1895 South Dakota census and the 1900 U.S. census.<sup>27</sup>

**Name:** By parents and early in life, given name was spelled “Maud.” From interview with Don Morgan, Maude spelled with an ‘e’ at the end and her middle name was Ione.

**Birth date:** Except for the 1930 census, all other censuses and the 1898 pension questionnaire are consistent with an 1879 birth year. 1900 census explicitly gives June 1879 for the birth date, though we do not know the informant. The 1930 census infers a birth year of 1880. The death record gives 1881 as the birth year which is impossible since there was a different sister born in 1881 who lived only two days (see note 24).

**Birth Location:** Census information shows family residing in Rock Grove Township at time of birth. In S. Dak. censuses, informants give birthplace as Nora Springs, Iowa, about 2.5 miles from Rock Grove. Therefore, reasonable to assume birth was in Nora Springs though family lived in Rock Grove.

early 1908, Maude and her family had relocated back to Walworth County, South Dakota, where Maude had her next child.<sup>30</sup> Maude's family lived in various locations surrounding Mobridge in Walworth, Dewey, and Corson counties where remaining children were born and where Maude was enumerated in 1915 and 1925 South Dakota censuses and the 1920 U.S. census.<sup>31</sup> By 1927, Maude's family relocated to Crook County, Wyoming where the family was enumerated in Hulett the 1930 U.S. census.<sup>32</sup> By 1935, the family had moved to the Devil's Tower area, still in Crook County, where they were enumerated in the 1940 U.S. census.<sup>33</sup> Maude continued to live in the Devil's Tower area until Bert Overseth's death in 1942.<sup>34</sup> Maude moved back to Mobridge, Walworth County, South Dakota, where she was referenced in a sister's obituary in 1943 and enumerated in the 1945 South Dakota census.<sup>35</sup> During the summer of 1949, Maude relocated to Sheridan, Sheridan County, Wyoming where she then passed away on 21 December 1954.<sup>36</sup> For each of the 1915 and 1920 South Dakota censuses, Maude

**Birth:** Location and dates are consistent between censuses and birth records.

Gladys married Edward Boehler, son of Freidrick and Clara (née Abrecht) Boehler, on 26 October 1926 in Pollock, Campbell County, South Dakota.<sup>48</sup> Gladys and her family lived in Township 127, Range 78, Campbell County, from at least 1930 to 1940 where they were enumerated in the 1930 and 1940 U.S. censuses and the 1935 South Dakota census.<sup>49</sup> By the 1945 state census, Gladys's family had relocated to Township 126, Range 78, still in Campbell County, South Dakota.<sup>50</sup> In both the 1935 and 1945 state censuses, Gladys listed her religious affiliation with the Reform Church.
